Olympic gold medalist to lead children's wrestling clinic in Hoboken

Henry Cejudo, an American who won a gold medal for wrestling at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, will be leading a children's wrestling clinic this Friday at Edge Hoboken Wrestling School, 352 Observer Highway.

Henry Cejudo, the youngest American to win an Olympic gold medal as of 2008, is planning to host a one-hour children's wrestling clinic at **Edge Hoboken Wrestling School**, 352 Observer Highway, this Friday. Cejudo will distribute signed copies of his autobiography, "Around the Horn," to participants.

The clinic is intended for children ages 6-18 – that's quite a range. Hopefully a high school senior won't be facing off against a 6-year-old in a fighting challenge.

Admission costs \$20, and the clinic starts at 6 p.m. The book signing

will immediately follow at 7 p.m.

Cejudo, the 23-year-old freestyle wrestler from Phoenix, co-wrote the memoir with Bill Plaschke, a sports columnist for **The Los Angeles Times**. His Web site is www.henrycejudo.com.
